## Goals

To increase the number of:

1. children who can remain safely in their own homes.
2. children and youth placed in least restrictive settings.
3. children who safely and permanently reunify with their families within 12 months.
4. To increase the percent of timely adoptions and guardianships.
5. To improve self-sufficiency and well-being for transition age youth emancipating from foster care. (data currently unavailable)

## Through 12/29/2008

Caseload (number)

- ↓ 8.6% decline in the child welfare cases.
- ↓ 16.3% decline in PYC service cases.
- ↑ 11.1% increase in FM service cases.
- ↑ 2.7% increase in FR service cases.

Percentage of children placed:

- ↓ In foster care decreased by 10.3%
- ↑ With relatives increased by 7.5%
- ↑ In county foster homes increased by 22.2%
- ↓ In group homes declined by 8.5%
- ↓ In FFA foster homes declined by 6.5%

## 12-month period ending November 30, 2008 compared to FY 06/07 baseline period:

Entries & Exits

- ↓ Foster care exits have exceeded entries, and 8.7% fewer children were placed out-of-home for 8 or more days
- ↓ Children entering foster care for the first time declined by 13.2%
- ↑ With relatives as their first placement increased by 64.1%\*
- ↑ Children reunified after a first entry within 12 months increased by 9.5% to 75.4%\*
- ↑ The percentage of children adopted within 24 months increased by 4.6% to 37.9%\*
- ↓ Children exiting to guardianship within 24 months decreased by 7.6% to 41.1%\*
